# **Annual Report for the year 2006-07**

# Health Education Project at Ghat, District Chamoli

Mamta Samajik Sanstha is undertaking a Health Education project at 40 primary schools and villages of Block Ghat, district Chamoli with the support of TPAK-JICA, Japan since 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2005. This project is being implemented through 40 primary schools in Ghat block with a goal to ensure physically and emotionally healthier lives of the students along with their families, teachers and community leaders. We are covering around 2000 students and their families through the activities of this project.

. This project aims to raise their awareness concerning health & Sanitation, leading to their adoption of more hygienic ways of life and thus improving public hygiene. In order to ensure sustainability of the project after the completion of the project, besides Parents Teachers Associations, we formed and strengthened women and adolescent groups in each of the project village. These groups have not only grown in the field of health care under our guidance but many of them have grown as good community leadership and formed their self help groups to initiate some livelihood activities. We also established health information hubs at the house of either senior health friends or child health volunteers. We have provided them with the IEC material on health related issues like RCH, Nutrition, TB, HIV/AIDS and other common diseases. Also we have linked them with local CHC and ANMs in order to provide primary health care and medical check up facilities through the health department even after project is over. We have conducted quarterly review meetings and capacity building trainings for all the project stakeholders including govt grassroot level functionaries and community leaders to help them understand their local issues better and plan local coordination to tackle these issues. We have also involved all concerning government officials from district and block level at every level of our activities in order to make them understand the needs of the community and support them accordingly. We have also brought out our quarterly news letter to share field experiences of our project with other stakeholders at other districts and state.

We have conducted following activities in our project schools and villages through our field staff like block coordinator, programme coordinator and 8 sector coordinators with the support of local volunteers and govt front line functionaries:

## **Main Activities of the Project:**

- 1. Village level orientation on health & hygiene with community
- 2. Health exhibition, Talk & quiz with community
- 3. Observed clean village drive with the community
- 4. Observed clean school drive with the students
- 5. Conducted health check up camps in schools and villages
- 6. Health exhibition, Talk and Quiz etc with the students in schools
- 7. Formation and orientation of Parents Teachers Associations(PTAs)
- 8. Formation and orientation of Women groups and adolescent girls groups
- 9. Review and capacity building trainings for all the stakeholders including grassroot level functionaries of govt concerned departments
- 10. Coordination with all the stakeholders and concerned govt deptts from Block level to District and District level to the State level.

## Outcomes under HEP, Ghat, Chamoli

- Volunteers like senior health friends and child health volunteers are placed in 100% project villages to get their support in their respective village to continue project activities.
- ♦ We have Parents Teachers Associations (PTAs) in 100% project villages and they will continue project activities in their respective school and village.
- ♦ We have undertaken clean villages drive with the help of the villagers and PTAs in 100% project villages to promote community health, personal and community hygiene.
- We have undertaken clean schools drive in 100% project schools with school children to promote clean school environment.
- ♦ We have organized health Check-up camps and given De-worming tablets in 100% project schools twice a year with the help of local ANMs and health department.
- More than 80% parents and children have increased their knowledge about personal hygiene, importance of safe drinking water and use of toilets, water borne diseases, use of Iodine salt, mother and child immunization and health care etc.
- More than 60% families have dug pit near their houses to throw garbage in it.
- The status of personal hygiene has increased in children by 70% to 80%.
- More than 80% children in school wash their hands by soap before having their mid day meal.
- 90% children have started brushing their teeth every day.
- 90% children cut their nails once a week.
- 70% children increased frequency of taking bath from once a week to twice a week.
- 100% schools have made the garbage pits with the help of children and they are using these pits to throw the garbage in it.

# **Additional outcomes**:

- ♦ We have established Health Information Centres at 100% project villages at the house of either child health volunteer or senior health volunteer and linked this centre with local school and ANM.
- More than 50% families have started using iodized salt.
- ♦ We have formed women and adolescent groups in all project villages to get their support for our programmes.

# **Project on Women Development Initiatives**

Supported By: TPAK-UNIFEM, Japan Progress Report January-March, 2007

The project **Women Development Initiatives** is being implemented in 5 backward villages of Vikasnagar Block, district Dehradun w.e.f Ist January, 07 with the support from TPAK-UNIFEM, Japan. We are focusing our project activities on women and adolescent girls in five villages as primary group and covering approximately 750 families and 3000 population of weaker section as a secondary group of the villages. There are five villages namely: Sabhawala, Sherpur, Shishambara, Tiparpur and Badripur being covered under the project, mostly having the population of scheduled tribe, scheduled caste, other backward class and Muslim. Two field coordinators are conducting project activities under the supervision of the chief coordinator, Mrs Beena Walia of the organization.

We have conducted following activities so far:

#### (1)-Project Introductory Meetings:

Mamta has conducted an introductory meetings in all selected 5 villages with primary target groups i.e. women and adolescent girls of the weaker section of the villages in the month of January, 2007 to acquaint them with the project activities and encourage their participation in the programme. These village level meetings were followed by one combined meeting of all 5 villages at village Sabhawala on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2007. This combined meeting was very successful as 80 women and adolescent girls from 5 project villages participated at the meeting. 26<sup>th</sup> January is our Republic day in India. So we used this occasion for women and girls to just enjoy, sing songs and have fun. We had some quiz, competition with them and gave away some prizes to encourage their participation and involvement in the project. We did not have very serious agenda in this meeting. It was just a get together to know each other and feel happy in the group. This meeting helped us to understand them and be friendly with them before launching our project activities.

#### (2)-Formation of Women and adolescent girls groups:

Mamta's field Coordinators, under the leadership of the Chief Coordinator, Mrs Beena Walia, have conduct meetings and discussion with women and adolescent girls to encourage them to form and work in a group. We told them the importance of working in the group. We found it very challenging to form them in a group because they never worked in a group before. It was a big task to bring them in a group. Our chief coordinator and field coordinators had series of meetings with them to motivate them to be part of the group. Again, we conducted activities of their interest like having fun, singing songs, quiz and sharing success stories of some groups which Mamta had formed in the past to encourage them. Finally, we could get success gradually in all the 5 villages by forming of one women and one adolescent girls group in each project village. The members of the each group were encouraged to select two members out of their group as leaders of their group to whom Mamta will provide training on leadership skills and all relevant issues pertaining to their group's health and sustainable development. Now we have women and adolescent group leaders in each project village.

#### (3)-Capacity Building Training for the Group Leaders & stakeholders:

Mamta has organized two day capacity building training for the project staff and leaders of the groups to orient them about the project objectives and activities. So that they may understand the project and actively participate at project various activities.

The training was organized at Village Meeting Hall, Sabhawala, Block Vikasnagar, Dehradun on 14-15 February, 2007. There were altogether 38 participants comprising women group leaders, adolescent girls' group leaders, project staff and resource persons. Since it was a first meeting or training, we decided to gather information about the participants and their respective villages in the introductory session to know their socioeconomic status and education background in order to set the baseline for the project. There were 32 participants present in the training. They all come from below poverty line families.80% out of total participants were from ST and 20% come from SC and other backward caste. Out of 32 women and girls,9 were illiterate,11 studied up to class 5<sup>th</sup>,6 studies up to class 8<sup>th</sup>,4 studied upto class 12<sup>th</sup> and 2 girls were doing their graduation. After having introduction and knowing background of the participants, Chief Functionary of Mamta Samajik Sanstha, Mr J.M.Singh shared the objectives of the project with the participants.

Further, he shared with the participants the strategy of the project. He said that the project will be implemented in 5 villages of Vikasnagar Block of District Dehradun with women and adolescent girls of weaker section of the villages in the current phase and will be replicated in other 15 villages of Vikasnagar in future after successful completion of the project. The current phase will be from 1st January, 2007 to 31 December, 2007, supported by TPAK-UNIFEM, Japan.

Ms Beena Walia, Chief Coordinator, Mamta shared the proposed activities of the project with the participants. She shared with the participants the proposed activities of the project and expected role of the group leaders to support various activities in terms of ensuring sustainability of the project.

She also told them that we have establishment one Women's Resource Rights Centre in the initial phase in one of the project village i.e. Sabhawala. This will be pilot to motivate the other groups and government to initiate other such pilots in other villages and districts. The centre will be utilized by the women groups and Adolescent Girls groups. Information available at Resource Centre will be shared with all project groups through education materials, handbills, letters etc. This Resource centre will be used to conduct their meetings and have some economic activities. Resource centre will gather information about various Govt. Schemes and disseminate the same to women's groups and adolescent groups at all project villages.

Besides giving above informations, Mr J.M.Singh and other resource persons shared various govt schemes with the participants and gave information about key issues like

Women and adolescent girl's health, nutrition, literacy, empowerment on their rights, legal literacy, female feticide and gender equality etc.

#### (4)- Observe International Women's Day:

Mamta observed International women's Day on 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2007 at its women Resource Right centre, Village Sabhawala, Block Vikasnagar with women and adolescent girls of scheduled caste, scheduled tribe and other backward castes. Mrs.Beena Walia, chief Coordinator encouraged women and girls by shouting slogans and singing songs with them on issues like their health, education, equality, legal and property rights, livelihoods, women unity and empowerment etc.

Mamta had put up an exhibition also on various women issues to raise awareness about their health, development and rights. Women and girls were so enthusiastic about the program. Many of them shared their views with joy that Mamta has given them a unique opportunity to know themselves, their strength, and their weakness and seek solution of their problems.

Mr J.M.Singh, Chief Functionary and Ms Beena, chief coordinator told women and girls about various schemes government is running for their health and development. Most of them heard about these schemes for the first time and none of them have ever taken any benefit from these schemes. Beside this, women and adolescent group leaders namely Ms Sushila, village Sabhawala, Ms Radha, village Tiparpur, Ms Barisa Begam, village Shishambara, Ms Dhan Maya, village Sherpur, Ms Vidhya, health volunteer and 4 aganwadi workers of 4 villages shared their views on women issues and shown their concern about gender equality. A quiz was also conducted with the participants asking those questions about health, govt schemes for women and girls. Ten women and girls were given prizes for correct answers.

To conclude the program, a women rally was taken out in the middle of the village Sabhawala just to raise voice for their rights and show their strength and unity. There were altogether 86 women and girls from all 5 villages of the project area.

#### (5) Social Mobilization Drive.

Social Mobilization drive is being undertaken in all 5 villages with the support from Project field coordinator, Women and adolescent Volunteer every fortnight on key issues like Women and adolescent girls health, development, literacy, empowerment on their rights, legal literacy, livelihoods, gender equality and female feticide etc through activities such as community meetings, orientations, competition and awareness camps etc. We are also involving village leaders and panchayat members (Local village elected body) in these activities to take their support for the upliftment of women and girls.

Mamta has also encouraged women and adolescent girls to form their self help groups. We are finding it really difficult to form them in a group due to various problems. We are helping them to sort out their problems one by one and form their self help group. We got some success in this regard and hope to have few self help groups in near future. We provided some training and orientation on as how to operate a self help group. We are also having discussion with local Banks and concerned govt officials to help them open their accounts in the Bank.

#### (6) Establishment of Women's Resource Rights Centre:

We have established one women's Resource Rights Centre at one of the project village i.e. Sabhawala. This centre is being used by the members of women and adolescent groups. We are conducting our major activities & training etc at this centre. Beside this, we have put posters, books, materials, leaflets, handouts newsletters on various topics related to health, govt schemes, women rights etc at the centre for their reading and information. We are also conducting sewing class at the centre to provide vocational skill to the members of women and girls groups. In near future, we are planning to conduct some vocational training with the help of various Govt. departments at our resource centre.

#### (7) Outcomes So Far:

- Identified 10 Women and adolescent volunteers in 5 project villages and provided them trainings as motivators to increase confidence of women and girls for demanding better services for their health and development.
- 5 Women groups and 5 adolescent girls groups have been formed in 5 villages and various activities have been conducted with them to boost their knowledge and skill.
- One village level women Resource Right Centre has been established at village Sabhawala.
- Running two sewing centres at village Sabhawala and village Tiparpur for women and girls.
- Strengthened relationship with community leaders and concerned govt officials and field workers to take their support for project activities.

#### Aan Project (Iodine Promotion Project)

Supported By: UNICEF/CREATE, Lucknow & Medical College, Allahabad, U.P.

Mamta has initiated a project called Aan Project (lodine Project) with the support from UNICEF/CREATE, Lucknow and technical support from M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad in 4 districts of U.P. i.e. Bijnor, J.P.Nagar, G.B.Nagar & Bagpat, covering all 27 blocks and 884 villages of these districts from April,2006 to March 2007. The purpose of this project was to create awareness about importance of iodized salt and increase its consumption at every household level through demand generation and testing of salt for iodine content by iodine field testing kit. This project was undertaken through 62 Inter Colleges of these districts. We have analyzed 19111 salt samples directly through our team and more than 30,000 salt samples through students volunteers of 62 colleges to know the iodine content in different brands of salts available in these villages and districts.

#### Role of Mamta As a Program Implementation Unit (PIU)

- ❖ Mamta worked in close coordination with the mother NGO, CREATE, Lucknow, UNICEF, Lucknow & MLN Medical College, Allahabad.
- ❖ Mamta worked closely with children of Middle/high School to (8<sup>th</sup> −12<sup>th</sup> standard) and raised demand for iodized salt and created awareness in community. Mobilized and motivated community for consumption of iodized salt through linkages with ongoing efforts of ICDS and other related sectors.
- Developed Linkages with district education, health, food and civil supplies, vyapar mandals, retailers at district and block headquarter and other distribution agencies to ensure increase in supply of iodized salt.

The project activities were coordinated very closely with the district officials including CMO, Basic Shiksha Adhikari (BSA), Food and civil and supplies etc.

#### INCREASING SUPPLY

This was done through following:

- ➤ Complete mapping of retailers, middle/high schools etc. at district and block headquarters. This facilitated preparation of micro plan and assisted in field level work.
- ➤ Quarterly District level meetings with vyapar mandals, primary traders, retailer, official of education, ICDS, principals of middle and high schools, health and food and civil supplies were organized at each district. This was done basically to sensitize the stakeholders toward ban order on usage of non iodized salt, importance of use of iodized salt, discourage use of non-iodized salt ,bargara and open salt, and ensure supply of IS at block level. Efforts were made to reach business community/retailers for promotion of consumption and requirement of IS. They were asked to address community meetings, take up as an agenda in their association meetings, and discourage sale of non iodized salt, participate in district level meetings and promote iodized salt through effective role of food inspectors, media, retailers etc.
- Advocacy for sale of packaged iodized salt by retailers were done by Mamta with the support of vyapar mandals, food inspector, health and education departments. This approach helped to ensure use of iodized salt by canteen, industrial houses and mid day meals of primary schools.
- In 4 districts, Mamta coordinated with minimum 15 retailers at block and 30 at city level to promote supply of IS. We have done salt testing of all the different kind of salts sold by them and advocated for sale of only IS. This was further coordinated with the food inspectors.

#### **DEMAND CREATION**

Created demand through school system and reached out to community through child to community approach. Children 11 to 18 years worked as messengers for demand creation. In rural areas children are enrolled in middle and high school from distant geographical areas. This provided greater outreach in terms of demand creation. They become very effective change agents and influenced the community and local market. Regular monitoring of iodine levels in salt from home brought by children also provided inputs for periodical monitoring of iodine levels in salt. Children were motivated to take out rallies at the local level to promote consumption of IS.

Children from Middle/High School were the main force for creating demand at home, market and amongst neighbors.

Mamta worked with 02 schools at district headquarters and 02 schools at each block headquarters. The school activity and time frame for each school were as follows:

- ❖ Around 150 direct salt samples were tested in each school every three months.. This helped develop demand for IS and study the trend in availability of IS.
- ❖ Mamta has made 4 visits to each school in a period of one year to gauge the increase in the demand of IS at household level.

The following activities were carried out with children:

- Orientation/awareness of children on use of iodized salt. This was done through information dissemination, meetings at school level, rallies etc.
- Trained teachers at school and retailers /wholesalers to carry salt testing .
- Demonstration through sample testing of salt collections brought by children from home/neighbors. Children were trained to test iodine level of salt.
- Emphasized usage of iodized salt. Facilitated the choice of salt to be purchased by demonstration through sample testing of salt sold in the market.
- Motivated children to create demand/buy only iodized salt and help promote the concept through their parents /neighbors.
- Motivated children to form local monitoring team. This team worked to monitor the level of iodine in the sample of salts collected by them from the retailers.
- Message display & slogans wall painting was done in at least 50+ villages of each block and in all the middle/senior schools of the district.
- Motivated community through village groups, anganwadi centres (AWC) and retailers to enhance demand for iodized salt.
- Conducted Sensitization meetings with the community through gram sabhas, members of PRI health committees etc.
- Organized Rallies at district level with school children.
- ❖ Worked consistently with the media and got good coverage by the media.
- Conducted Project activities in 62 colleges, covering 884 villages of 27 Blocks in 4 districts of western U.P.
- Analyzed total 19111 salt samples for iodine content, collected from 884 villages. Iodine content was found below 15 PPM in 11564 salt samples out of total samples.
- ❖ Beside this, 8-10 students were given iodine field testing kit and they were taught as how to test salt sample for iodine content. More than 30,000 salt samples were analyzed by students for iodine content and they shared the result of the sample with the concerned families and motivated the family if iodine content was less than 15 PPM.

Analysis report of samples/Brands was shared with concerned Chief Medical Officers of the districts to take necessary action to stop sale of those brands.

### Outcomes under WFP & Forest Deptt Project, Chamoli

- ♦ We have either formed or strengthened one women group and one adolescent girls group in each project village in total 18 villages.
- ♦ Identified and trained one women/adolescent girl as village volunteer called "Poshan Swasthya Saheli" in all project villages to get their support in implementation of project activities in their respective villages and prepare them for future leadership to continue project activities in their village even after the project.
- ◆ Approximately 70-75 % women, adolescent girls, school children and their families have got knowledge on issues like health, nutrition and hygiene.
- Knowledge and access on ANC, PNC services increased.100% pregnant mothers got themselves registered with local A.N.M. and 60% out of them started consuming IFA tablets.
- ♦ 70% mothers have understood the importance of mother's first milk and exclusive breastfeeding up to 6 months.50% out of them have started exclusive breastfeeding.
- ♦ 80% mothers have understood the importance of initiating semi-solid food after the completion of 6 months and 80% out of them have started semi-solid food after completion of 6 months.
- ♦ 80% mothers have understood the importance of child immunization and 70% out of them have taken their children to ANM centre for immunization.

- ◆ 70% mothers know about causes of diarrhea and heard about ORS packet.60% out of them are using ORS packets.
- ♦ 80% families in the project area know about importance of iodized salt. Their salt has been tested by iodine field testing kit. 60% out of them have started using iodized salt.
- ♦ 70% mothers and adolescent girls started visiting ANM and local aganwadi centre and more than 60% of them started using their services.
- ♦ More than 80% parents and children have increased their knowledge about personal hygiene, importance of safe drinking water and use of toilets, water borne diseases, use of Iodine salt, mother and child immunization and health care etc.
- ♦ We have undertaken clean villages drive with the help of group members in all the 18 villages to promote community health, personal and community hygiene.
- ♦ We have undertaken clean schools drive in all project schools with school children to promote clean school environment.
- More than 60% families have dug pit near their houses to throw garbage in it.
- The status of personal hygiene has increased in children by 70% to 80%.
- More than 80% children in school wash their hands by soap before having their mid day meal.
- 90% children have started brushing their teeth every day.
- 90% children cut their nails once a week.
- 70% children increased frequency of taking bath from once a week to twice a week.
- ♦ 100% schools have made the garbage pits with the help of children and they are using these pits to throw the garbage in it.
- ◆ IEC material like posters, flash cards, handbills, brochures etc has been placed in all the project schools, aganwadi centres and ANM centres.

## **Total Sanitation Campaign:**

Mamta Sanstha has initiated a project called Total Sanitation campaign in two blocks of two districts i.e Ghat block in Chamoli and Jaharikhal Block in district Pauri Garhwal from July 2006 with the support from Water and Sanitation deptt under its Swajal Project. This project was started in 10 revenue villages of each block with an objective to motivate people to construct low cost toilets in order to raise better health and hygiene condition their respective village. Our project staff conducted baseline

survey in these villages to know the status as how many families are using toilets. We have found that only 20% families were using toilets in these villages. This was followed by open meetings with community in each village to motivate them for clean village environment and construct toilet if they are not using toilet so far. Our staff used various tools like group discussion, posters, flash card, leaflets and wall writing on important places to inform people about importance of clean village environment, clean drinking water and using toilet. We supported particularly the families below poverty line to help them to construct their toilet. A sum of Rs 1,200/- was given by Swajal project to these families as a subsidy or incentive to construct their own toilet and use it. We have also formed village water and sanitation committees in these villages to seek local support in the programme. We have constructed 46 toilets including 16 toilets for below poverty line in Ghat block, Chamoli and 42 toilets including 24 toilets for B.P.L. families in Jaharikhal, district Pauri Garhwal under our direct observation and supervision. Now gradually, people have understood the importance of using toilets and they are willing to construct their own toilet. However, scarcity of water is the biggest hurdle in the process of constructing toilets. Hence, government has to ensure the access of water supply to increase construction and use of toilets.
